#### **OUR NEW UNIFORM**

#### Available to be ordered late Term 3/Early Term 4

The below image is a sample of our uniform. The Academic shorts and pants are not displayed.

The dress is a Summer and Winter dress. It can be worn in Summer with socks or Winter with Navy blue tights. This New uniform has been designed **to be adhered to.** The PE Shorts and Track Pants have a white St Joseph's Logo on them to differentiate between the PE Uniform and the Academic Uniform. The new uniform will have a two year transition period but it must be worn correctly and not include alternative uniform items bought elsewhere. Children can either wear our current uniform or our new uniform while transitioning over the 2 year period

All students must be in the correct uniform at all times.

#### <u>NEW UNIFORM -</u>

At this week's assembly, our school community was introduced to the new uniform for St. Joseph's. We are nearing the final stages of formalising the launch date, and more information will be provided within the next two weeks. The new uniform is designed to be gender and season neutral, offering a variety of items to suit different preferences. For now, Noone will operate from our current school uniform shop, but this is a temporary arrangement. Once the St. Joseph's Parish House (the Old School House next to St. Joseph's Church) is refurbished, a new Uniform Shop will open to serve both St. Joseph's and FCJ. Uniforms can be ordered in person at the school uniform shop, and there will also be an option to order online. We will provide more information regarding when orders will open.

We are hoping that the NEW UNIFORM for St Joseph's Benalla will be available to be purchased both online and in our Uniform Shop at the end of Term 3/Early Term 4. This will be confirmed over the next few weeks.

Creating safer school zones

#### **Kiss & Go Rules**

Unlike a No Stopping area, where you cannot stop for any length of time, you are allowed to stop and park for a short time in a No Parking aka 'Kiss & Go' area as long as you are;

- · dropping off or picking up passengers,
- you don't stay for any longer than 2 minutes, and
- you don't move more than 3 metres away from your vehicle.

You can therefore, get out of your car to set your child on their way, as long as you remain within 3 metres of your car and don't stay any longer than 2 minutes.

#### Remember

- To assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain with their car (within 3 metres) whilst children get in and out.
- If your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes you must leave and re-enter the Kiss & Go zone.
- Please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side.
- Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone, as far forward as possible.
- Observe traffic when entering or leaving the zone.
- Do not do a U-turn in busy school zones.





#### Father's Day Cooking

#### Coconut balls

#### Ingredients

- · Sweet biscuits digestive or Marie biscuits 500 grams
- · 800grams of sweetened condensed milk
- · 2 cups of coconut
- · 50 grams of cocoa powder
- · 260 grams of coconut for rolling

#### Method

- Place half a packet of the biscuits at a time into the food processor
- Crush the biscuits until they resemble fine breadcrumbs, remove ar place into a large bowl, continue until all the biscuits are finished.
- Place cocoa powder, coconut in the bowl with the biscuits and mix through.
- 4. Add the condensed milk and stir until well combined.
- Roll the mixture into small balls then roll the balls into the coconut and place onto platters lined with baking paper.
- Make sure you keep washing your hands so all the dough does not end up on your hands
- Continue until all the balls have been rolled, then place in the fridge to set.

#### Shortbread

#### Ingredients

- · 250 grams of butter
- · 110 grams of sugar
- · 360 grams of flour

#### Method

- \* Heat the oven to 190 degrees Celsius
- \* Beat the butter and sugar together until smooth
- \* Stir in the flour to get a smooth paste. Turn onto a work surface and gently roll the pastry until the pastry is 1 cm thick.
- \* Cut into rounds and place on a baking tray lined with baking paper. Sprinkle with sugar and place and chill in the fridge for 30 minutes.
- \* Bake in the oven for 15 minutes or until pale golden brown.
- \* Remove from the tray and place onto 2 large platters.

EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education.
Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

#### Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

#### Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

#### What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

"Day off" – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

Truancy – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

 Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.  Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Training Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.
