Catholic Social Teaching Focus: Week Ten

The Earth and all life on it are part of God's creation. We are called to respect each other and take responsibility for taking care of each other. This week all students learn and understand that we are all part of one big family, no matter where we come from, how much we own, or what we believe. Everything and everyone is connected because we are all created by God and belong to the same beautiful world. As stated in the St Joseph's Identity Statement, to which we all aspire, "St. Joseph's is a welcoming, Catholic, child safe school community, that nurtures and values each person, knowing God lives in all of us," This statement is strongly connected to our Catholic Social Teaching focus for the week.

Three examples of how St Joseph's students can show solidarity daily:

- 3. **Standing up for others:** If a child notices anyone being treated unfairly or excluded, they can speak up to an adult or invite the person to join their group.

Creating safer school zones

Kiss & Go Rules

Unlike a No Stopping area, where you cannot stop for any length of time, you are allowed to stop and park for a short time in a No Parking aka 'Kiss & Go' area as long as you are;

- · dropping off or picking up passengers,
- you don't stay for any longer than 2 minutes, and
- you don't move more than 3 metres away from your vehicle.

You can therefore, get out of your car to set your child on their way, as long as you remain within 3 metres of your car and don't stay any longer than 2 minutes.

Remember

- To assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain with their car (within 3 metres) whilst children get in and out.
- If your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes you must leave and re-enter the Kiss & Go zone.
- Please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side.
- Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone, as far forward as possible.
- Observe traffic when entering or leaving the zone.
- Do not do a U-turn in busy school zones.





EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education.
Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

"Day off" – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

Truancy – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

 Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up. Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Training Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.
