

Ash Wednesday and the Beginning of Lent



Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, a special time in the Church that helps us prepare for Easter. On this day, people receive ashes on their foreheads as a sign of turning back to God. The ashes remind us that life is a gift, and we are called to live with love and kindness.

Smart Planning: Teachers make the most of their planning time by focusing on key parts of the lesson and deciding where students may need extra support.

Using Professional Judgement: Teachers adjust their lessons to ensure students understand key ideas, sometimes spending more or less time on certain concepts.

Naplan 2025

"The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7, and across Australia. It evaluates essential skills in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar, and punctuation), and numeracy, providing insights into students' progress and assisting schools in identifying areas needing support".



In 2025, the NAPLAN test window is scheduled from Wednesday, 12 March to Monday, 24 March. The testing sequence typically begins with the writing test, followed by reading, conventions of language and numeracy.

While specific information about St Joseph's practice test schedule isn't publicly available, schools generally conduct practice tests to familiarise students with the NAPLAN format and process. These practice sessions often occur in the weeks leading up to the official tests. St Joseph's will commence practice tests within the next fortnight to prepare Year 3 and 5 students for the assessments.



Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of LENT. We change the prayer table in our classrooms to purple to mark the important Lenten season in our liturgical calendar. Lent is a period of 40 days leading up to Easter. It is a time that symbolises Jesus fasting in the desert. On Ash Wednesday students will have a cross marked on their forehead symbolising the beginning of Lent - this may happen at Mass if your child is attending Church that day OR as part of a liturgy with the teacher in the classroom.

MacqLit and MiniLit SAGE

MacqLit and MiniLit SAGE.

As part of our MAGNIFY initiative we will be running two programs that offer additional support for those students across Years 1-6 who would benefit from extra support in literacy.

Students will be identified for these programs based on relevant testing data. There are several tests scores that will be considered, including students' decoding skills and their ability to read a whole piece of text.

MiniLit SAGE: This is for students in Years 1 & 2 of schooling. Students will work in small groups of 4, or 1-1 if needed, for four times a week. They will engage in one-hour sessions and work on developing all the skills essential for literacy success, including Phonemic awareness, Phonics, Vocabulary, Fluency and Comprehension. The Phonics component of this program follows a very structured and sequential sequence for introducing all the sounds used in English.

MacqLit: This is for students in Years 3-6 of schooling. Students will work in small groups of 4-6 for one-hour sessions, four times a week. They continue to build on the foundation skills essential for literacy success, including Phonemic awareness, Phonics, Vocabulary, Fluency and Comprehension. The MacqLit intervention program includes a strong focus on Spelling and Dictation daily. Like MiniLit SAGE, this program has a set sequence for introducing the sounds used in reading.

Attendance at school has a strong impact on student learning and progress. It is essential that students are present and ready to learn every day at school, except in unavoidable circumstances like sickness, family bereavement etc. Constant, unexplained absences may jeopardise a student's placement on the program.

MiniLit SAGE will commence soon once training has been provided. Our MacqLit program will commence shortly.

MacqLit will be co-ordinated and run by Miss Maria Pomponio, Mrs Leanne Pritchard and Ms Kristy Rawlings.

This is not a free dress day.





EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education.
Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

"Day off" – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

Truancy – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

 Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up. Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Training Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.
